

PEREGRINE QUEST From A Naturalist's Field Notebooks by Clayton M. White



Macdonald, H., Soft Bound, 208 Pages, 2006, and 5 1/4 x 7 1/5. A sacred god, a military tool, an erotic symbol: the falcon is a natural wonder of speed, power, beauty, and ferocity that has become embedded in human cultures in myriad ways. Helen Macdonald's *Falcon* examines the diverse symbolism and roles attached to the falcon throughout the centuries.

Macdonald presents a cultural and natural history of the falcon that spans the globe and several millennia. Her wideranging survey considers the many facets of the falcon, including conservation efforts; the sport of falconry; and the use of falcons in secret military projects by the Third Reich and the U.S. space program. Falcon also explores the rich imagery of the falcon over history, including the veneration of falcons as gods in ancient Egypt, their role in erotic stories, and even the use of falcons in advertising. In a seguel to his 2001 title, Falconry in the Land of the Sun, celebrated Afghan falconer Sirdar Mohamed Osman gives the world a unique view both of falconry and of his native land. Osman comes from a long line of falconers and has flown many raptors. This book covers the raptors of India, Afghanistan and neighboring areas very well. The hawks are divided by eye color: dark-eyed (falcons) and yellow-eyed (shortwings, eagles and buzzards) birds of prey. It contains chapters on Practical and Historical information; on Falconry and Birds of Brey; and Appendices.

HARRIS' HAWK DAYS

Hollinshead, M., Hard Bound, 117 Pages, Color Dust Wrapper, and 5 1/2 x 8 1/2.

Some will say that getting to the bird—to any bird—is every falconer's responsibility, regardless of risk. But those most familiar with the Harris' will admit there is something more "something strange," in the motivation to help a bird that at some indefinable point became your partner and your friend.

It is surprising, given this hawk's popularity and wide distribution, so few good books about them exist. Harris' hawk stories are common enough in our periodicals but notably rare in hardcover. Like rabbit hawking, the Harris' as a topic generally gets a chapter or two. Martin Hollinshead, in just a few monographs, more than doubled the volume of books in print dedicated to the Harris'. Were he less successful and experienced a hawker, or a poor writer, this might not be an improvement. But we got lucky: These are good, useful books and fun to read.
